

Teaching Plan - People Jesus met: A very rich man

Aim - To show Jesus loves us but it is not always easy to be his friend.



Welcome



Activity

Lead some simple aerobic exercises - perhaps to music. Get everyone to copy what you do.

Stop after a short time once everyone has got the idea. Choose two people to be leaders, each standing on opposite sides of the group. Explain that you want the leaders to do their own exercises. Tell the group they need to choose one of the leaders to follow. Start again and run it for a few minutes.

Explain that the Bible passage today gives us another choice about who to follow.

Drama

A rich young man

"Oh, I've always done that," Ben told him. "I am a very good man. I have been good since I was a wee boy. I never hurt anyone. I never take anything that is not mine. I don't tell lies. I love my family. What else?"

Talk -
